Community Hubs



Redbridge Council is building **six new Community Hubs** across the borough, state of the art libraries with extra services, like GP surgeries and children's nurseries. Local people are helping design the Hubs and decide which services to include in each one.

Enforcement Hubs

Bringing police and Council Enforcement Officers back into communities, Enforcement Hubs deter criminals, help reduce crime and provide a base for police patrols.



Mobile Enforcement Hub

Redbridge Council's Mobile Enforcement Hub brings police and Council Enforcement Officers to every doorstep in Redbridge, keeping our borough safe.

Investing in parks

Following **£1.6m** investment in playgrounds and outdoor gyms, Redbridge Council is now upgrading all public toilets in parks and public spaces in Redbridge.

Investing in new paving, lighting, planters and benches to spruce up our town high streets and town centres.



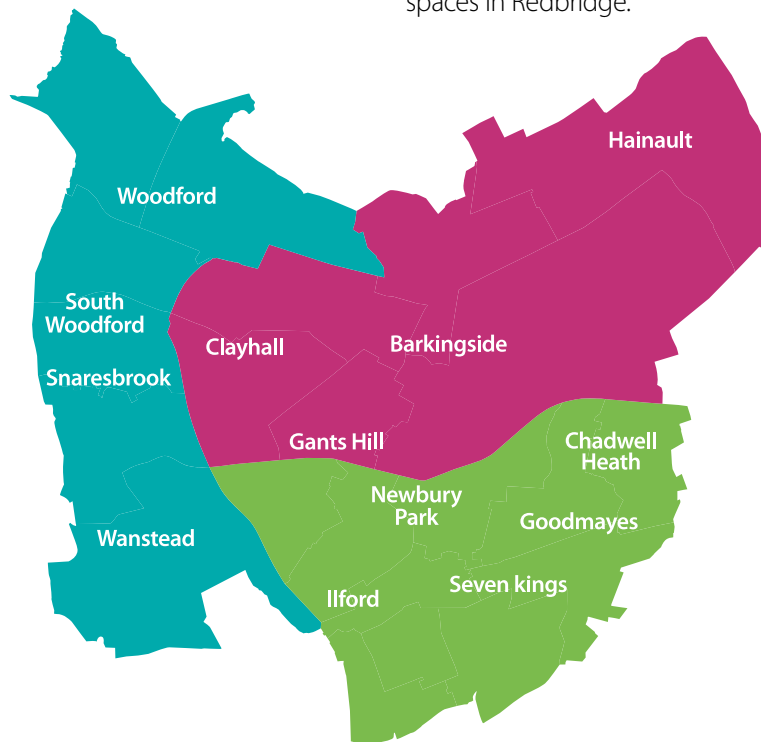
Hainault Forest Country Park

Fairlop Waters

Following the arrival of a fleet of new council funded sailing boats, Fairlop Waters is set to double in size over the coming years, with new adventure trails, rewilding areas and potentially a wild swimming lake.

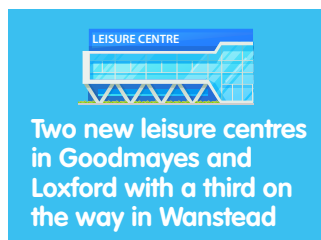
