

Safer Redbridge Strategy

The Redbridge Community Safety Partnership has responded to the clear message from residents and businesses that lowering crime is paramount to making Redbridge a good place to live, work and visit, and are confident that the priorities in this Plan reflect this.

This Safer Redbridge Strategy identifies five key priorities that all statutory and voluntary organisations within the partnership agree to focus their resources on, working collaboratively to maximise the effect we can have as a collective body. Each of the priorities listed have associated delivery mechanisms and dynamic action plans to drive them forward. The priorities established in 2018 will be reviewed annually to ensure that they continue to address the most pressing crime and disorder issues in the Borough. If priorities are changed in the future this document will be updated to reflect them.

Establishing the Priorities

The following criteria have been used to set the Partnership priorities in Redbridge for the period of this strategy:

- a) **Collective partnership impact:** Areas of work where the Partnership is best placed to have the largest cooperative impact because of the amount of cross cutting, coordinated, partnership work involved.
- b) **Impact on victims:** Some crimes have a more significant impact on a victim than others. For example, the differing impact of shoplifting or criminal damage compared to that of residential burglary or domestic violence are hugely contrasting for a victim.
- c) **Quality of life for local Residents:** Local surveys and national research have been used to ensure priorities are focused on problems that have the largest impact on residents' general quality of life.
- d) **Tackling crime and disorder priorities** identified through detailed crime analysis.
- e) **Ensuring strong links and local delivery of Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC) Police and Crime Plan**

- Support schools and institutions to comply with the Prevent Duty
- Deliver effective Home Office funded Prevent projects to address local risk
- Ensure referral pathways are streamlined, clear, effective and needs are assessed against thresholds.
- Deliver effective monthly, fully attended, multi-agency Channel Panel & Prevent Case Management meetings to ensure appropriate support is provided to vulnerable individuals

- Train frontline staff
- Raise awareness amongst staff with communications campaign
- Cascade best practice through Champions/SPOCs
- Publicise referral pathways opportunities
- Explore corporate induction training
- Monitor and analyse NRM referrals

- Work with businesses on responsible business practices
- Implement measures into contracts across the partnership
- Produce a Mission Statement

- Embed Referral Pathways
- Undertake pilot project for enhanced support for NRM exit
- Conduct joint operations with the GLAA
- Carry out two Redbridge Action Days

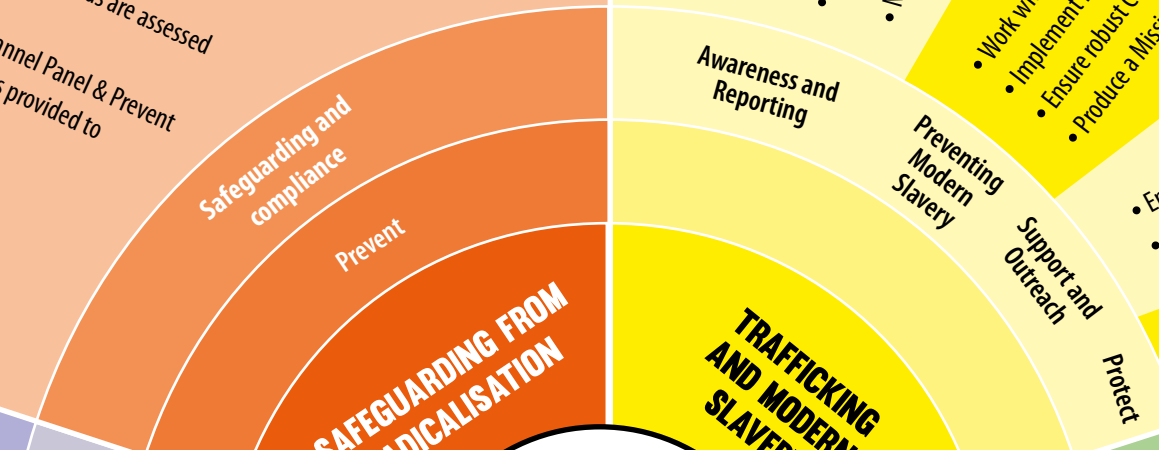
