Ambitious 'Redbridge Plan' will make borough cleaner, safer, and healthier

Tackling poverty and the soaring costs of living whilst building a cleaner, greener, fairer, and healthier borough are key ambitions of a new four-year blueprint to improve Redbridge.

In July, we will publish 'The Redbridge Plan 2022-26' which sets out how we will work to deliver improvements across the borough following the May election.

The plan aims to address the borough's unique challenges whilst unleashing its untapped potential following a period of uncertainty caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

It also considers the current economic backdrop and pressures on local people caused by the 'cost of living' crisis; and sets out ideas for improvements at the council to guarantee it can operate within its budget.



Cllr Jas Athwal, Leader of Redbridge Council, said:

"We have ambitious plans to help reduce the financial strain on local families throughout the 'cost of living' crisis, and to improve wellbeing by

focusing on the issues that matter most to our neighbours, and enhance the lives of everyone who lives, works or studies in Redbridge.

"We've been knocking on doors and speaking to local people from all four corners of the borough to hear about the issues that matter to them. We've listened to residents' views and incorporated them into the Redbridge Plan.

"Over the next four years, we will be focusing on delivering safer streets, better health, cleaner neighbourhoods, a greener environment, improved access to skills and jobs, more decent and affordable homes, and stronger communities.

"We also know we need to be adaptable and respond to circumstances we cannot control. For example, we know that some of our neighbours will be struggling now with increases in household bills and general economic uncertainty, and we are currently exploring what we can do, working with our partners to provide advice and support."

Community Hubs

An integral part of this plan will be establishing a network of 'Community Hubs' across the borough, which will concentrate on, and enhance many services and amenities in one location, bringing them closer to where people live and offering opportunities for communities to collaborate. The council will deliver hub buildings in Seven Kings, Gants Hill, and Hainault over the next four years.

The Redbridge Plan sets out an ambitious set of improvements under four themes:

Safe & Healthy



To deliver our ambition for safer streets, we will:

- Open a Police Hub in Woodford and roll out further Enforcement Hubs, giving local people an opportunity to raise concerns directly with police and council enforcement officers
- Improve security in parks with park patrol officers and refurbish park toilets
- Upgrade street lighting, create a night-time enforcement team, set up a street-watch scheme, increase CCTV coverage and establish a community speed-watch scheme to curb speeding

To deliver our ambition to improve health, we will:

- Open a new swimming pool in Wanstead
- Open a lido in Valentines Park
- Double the size of Fairlop Waters
- Improve and expand our tennis courts and cricket pitches
- Invest £200,000 in park play equipment
- Support people with substance misuse problems with successful treatment options

Jobs & Skills

To deliver our ambition to improve opportunities to help residents' develop skills and find work, we will:

- Work with partners to bring a university campus to Redbridge
- Deliver skills training through Redbridge Institute and employment advice through Work Redbridge
- Increase the number of apprenticeships in the council
- Guarantee all care leavers' work experience and an interview for a council apprenticeship
- Work with our schools to close the attainment gap and support all our schools to be Ofsted rated 'Good' or 'Outstanding'
- Reduce the number of young people not in employment, education, or training
- Deliver a new youth hub in Hainault
- Open new community markets for start-up businesses
- Deliver new programmes to support businesses to flourish, including making it simpler for local businesses to win public contracts

Homes & Neighbourhoods

To deliver our ambition for more social and affordable homes and drive improvements to our neighbourhoods, we will:

- Build 500 council homes and deliver 1,000 affordable homes
- Deliver a new and improved borough-wide landlord licensing scheme to help crack-down on rogue landlords and improve local housing standards
- Begin work on the Western gateway to the borough
- Deliver our flagship housing schemes in Clements Road and Loxford
- Reduce the number of people living in temporary accommodation and support those sleeping rough into sustainable housing



Clean & Green

To deliver our ambition to improve the environment of Redbridge, we will:


- Invest £10 million to resurface roads
- Plant 20,000 trees, create up to 160,000sqm of wild spaces and new pocket parks and community gardens
- Open 1,000 electric car charging points and deliver 200 cycle racks and hangers
- Invest £830,000 in flood prevention measures
- Deliver cleaner air zones around schools and put in place air quality monitors across the borough

I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Stuart Bell and I recently became the Borough Commander for East Area Police, which includes Redbridge.

I am looking forward to supporting local Redbridge communities by helping to deliver the best possible policing services for you all.

My main priority for Redbridge is to focus on what's important to residents and the crimes that cause the most harm. This includes targeting violence, including violence against women, reducing antisocial behaviour, and preventing and detecting crimes that impact peoples' lives the most.

Our new Ilford Town Centre Team consisting of 25 Police Officers was introduced in February. I am pleased to say that they have already made a significant difference to levels of confidence for local businesses and shoppers. The team are working tirelessly with key partners like Redbridge Council and the BID to improve the town centre for residents and visitors.

I want all of our public spaces and business districts to be safe and thriving areas that we are all proud to be associated with.

It is also essential that all our residents, especially women, feel safe in Redbridge. We have introduced 'Walk & Talk' – an initiative where residents can request to take a walk with an officer and highlight any areas they feel unsafe in. We then work with Redbridge Council to help address the issues raised.

To help make these changes, we also need your support, so please keep your neighbourhood police informed of any issues and concerns as their updates directly influence local priorities. So please join your local officers at the Ward Panel meetings.

Together we can help prevent car crime

Responding to local neighbourhood issues and concerns relating to motor vehicle crime, we recently purchased 1,500 signal-blocking pouches, which when your electric key is stored inside, prevents thieves from cloning the data and accessing your vehicle.

The pouches are being hand delivered by police officers in Redbridge in hotspot locations, who will also be providing residents with additional car crime prevention advice. We are doing this to publicise car security and encourage residents to consider investing in deterrents like signal-blockers, steering locks and immobilisers.

Cabinet Member for Crime, Safety and Community Cohesion, Cllr Khayer Chowdhury, said:

"Motor vehicle crime is a top concern amongst some residents. It's really important we all take steps to protect our vehicles. Purchasing a signal-blocking pouch, a good steering lock and investing in a good immobiliser can deter car thieves. As a council, we have already invested £1.5 million in ANPR and CCTV cameras which are helping the police with identifying and intercepting stolen vehicles. I am asking residents to make their vehicles harder for thieves to target by using good security options."

Visit your local Enforcement Hub today

Redbridge Enforcement Hubs bring police and council enforcement officers into neighbourhoods, empowering local people to report any concerns about crime and antisocial behaviour directly.

Redbridge Enforcement Hubs are open for anyone to visit, providing a great opportunity to discuss any concerns face-to-face.

The Ilford Enforcement Hub can be found next to the York Road entrance to Ilford Station and is open every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 4.30pm-6.30pm.

The Hainault Enforcement Hub is located on Manford Way, next to Hainault Library and is open Monday-Thursday, 11am-1pm and at varying times Friday-Sunday.

Across Redbridge there was a record number of street parties, with just under 100 Redbridge neighbourhoods hosting an event, one of the highest numbers of any London borough. Around 13,000 local people came together to celebrate with their neighbours.

Redbridge Wall of Shame helps identify fly-tippers and grime crime offenders in the borough



Fly-tippers and other grime crime offenders in Redbridge could find themselves on a new public Wall of Shame appealing for local people to come forward with information about them.

Redbridge Council's new Redbridge Wall of Shame is a microsite dedicated to identifying people caught on camera trashing our borough – making it harder for the culprits to evade justice.

Since launching in March, the site has been sharing monthly clips of environmental crimes and footage of fly-tippers dumping their rubbish illegally on our streets – selfishly making neighbourhoods messy and causing road and walkway obstructions for others living in the borough.

Keeping up the pressure on the lawbreakers, the new Wall of Shame empowers local people to help bring the mess-makers to justice by reporting anyone they can identify from the clips.

Within six weeks of launching, Redbridge Wall of Shame had already notched up nearly 10,000 page views.

Local tip-offs from the March and April editions of Wall of Shame have led to a person being identified and issued with a £400 Fixed Penalty Notice for fly-tipping in Ilford, as well as the Enforcement Team currently investigating a graffiti offence in Hainault.

Redbridge Cabinet Member for Environment and Civic Pride, Cllr Jo Blackman, said: "Our Redbridge Wall of Shame is already resulting in tip-offs from the community and empowering local people to help in the fight

against fly-tipping to catch those responsible for making our streets messy. By working together as one community we can make it harder for fly-tippers to dump their rubbish in Redbridge, or think they can get away with it." To ensure maximum impact in the fight against fly-tipping, Redbridge Council invested in a range of new cameras for the Wall of Shame initiative, allowing enforcement teams to monitor fly-tipping hot spots that were previously hard to track with existing equipment.

The new cameras enable our teams to quickly and easily deploy staff to an identified fly-tipping hotspot, giving us the ability to tackle fly-tipping locations as soon as they are arising.

Redbridge Wall of Shame forms part of our on-going work to create a cleaner and greener borough, and under our tough stance on grime crime, we will fine or prosecute any individual or business caught fly-tipping in Redbridge.

Enforcement action is also coupled with other council-led fly-tipping initiatives, including community engagement work, free online workshops on reducing and disposing of waste properly, and targeted fly-tipping operations.


Recent activities have included successful court prosecutions in relation to fly-tips discovered in the borough, as well as a joint council and policeled operation targeting vehicles transporting waste in a bid to weed out potential fly-tippers.

Keeping Redbridge safe this summer



We recently launched a new mobile patrol service to prevent and detect antisocial behaviour in our parks.

The new Parkguard service patrols Redbridge parks, tackling crime, antisocial behaviour and environmental crime through engagement, enforcement and education.

Parkguard work with the Police, Redbridge Council's Enforcement Teams, Friends of Parks, volunteers, and park visitors to keep our parks safe.

The service has two mobile Parkguard officers on duty seven days per week, plus two canine patrol officers Amy and Logan.

The new park patrol is already having a positive impact and making Redbridge a safer place. The team recently had to swoop into action and managed to stop a robbery in progress, following a tip-off from members of the public. Marion Trofin, Supervisor for ParkGuard in Redbridge, said: "The most important thing is that we're here for the community. We also need the help of our neighbours to do our job as best we can.

"We've been very encouraged that people are now starting to approach us, and they mainly want to inform us about low-level crime, such as antisocial behaviour.


"We're pleased that we're beginning to build a good rapport with young people. We're getting these positive results as we've made ourselves approachable. We believe that education and prevention are far more effective than enforcement."

Marion and his team were on duty during the recent Eid celebrations in Valentines Park and Goodmayes Park and remarked on how positive the experience was. **Marion, said:** "We've never seen anything like it elsewhere in London. We had kids coming up to us to get their pictures taken throughout the celebrations. It really made us feel part of the community, and we thoroughly enjoyed being a part of it.

The Deputy Leader of Redbridge Council, Cllr Kam Rai, said: "We want our neighbours across Redbridge and beyond to have a great time visiting our award-winning parks.

"The Parkguard patrol officers will provide support and assistance to park visitors, work closely with council enforcement officers and the police, and use their experience and diplomacy to nip any problems in the bud before they escalate.

"Say hello when you see them; they're here to help."





2022 local elections – the results

At the start of May, voters in Redbridge went to the polls to have their say on who represents them at a local level.



REDBRIDGE GO GREEN GRANTS Home Upgrade Grant

The Home Upgrade Grant can provide grants of up to £25,000 per home. The amount of funding will depend on the outcome of a property survey and the current Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating. Funding is only available for properties that are off gas grid e.g. electric, oil, LPG or coal.

The scheme will offer insulating measures including: external wall and cavity wall insulation, underfloor and loft insulation. Other remedial works may be offered but this will be dependent on the existing condition of the property.

To be eligible for the grants, your property must have an Energy Performance Certificate rating of E, F or G and a household income of less than £30k per year.

Owner occupiers, landlords and tenants are eligible for funding.

In the case of rental properties, the income eligibility relates to the property's tenants.

We'll help local people meet soaring costs of living

With rises in energy, petrol and food prices, thousands of households across our borough have been feeling the squeeze.

We know that many households are suffering in this cost-of-living crisis, and we want to help with extra support, help to find work and improve skills, and help with emergencies.

Earlier this year, we spent £2 million to help Redbridge families and individuals needing extra support throughout the winter months. Through our Household Support Fund (HSF), we've provided 43,000 awards of support in different ways, including food, energy and water costs and providing essentials like warm clothing, sanitary products, soap, boiler servicing and buying appliances.

A further £2 million has been spent on supporting local people through to September 2022, and our teams are working quickly to mobilise support for those in greatest need.

To access the HSF, residents must be referred by a professional currently working with them or their family, such as a social worker, family support worker or their child's school.

Cllr Kam Rai, Deputy Leader of Redbridge Council, said:

"The council is working with its partners to look at all the ways we can help our neighbours in Redbridge during these very difficult times. Everyone is feeling the pinch from higher prices, but we know there are people



really struggling to make ends meet, and we will target help where it will have greatest impact. If you are struggling with your bills, please get in touch with one of our teams as soon as possible."


