Main Modifications Redbridge Local Plan 2015 to 2030

Dear Sir or Madam,

I amongst many other people such as the Ilford NOISE group still oppose the modifications to the local plan, as it

will involve far too great an amount of high rise as well as high density development within the Ilford, Goodmayes, Seven

Kings and Chadwell Heath neighbourhoods. The scale of the planned high storey buildings will block daylight for the

nearby residents and will inevitably create more congestion which will worsen the quality of life around this part of the

Redbridge borough.

Also the car parking spaces allocations are generally far too low for these types of residential developments

which will result in a higher number of cars being parked in surrounding areas too. Ilford really needs a larger amount

of low level commercial units with associated landscaping around it because the borough needs them rather than high

rise and often cramped as well as unaffordable housing. Above all, the council needs to strictly limit the construction of

more tower blocks especially when incidents such as the Grenfell Tower tragedy have proved that high density living is

neither particularly safe nor desirable.
