# LEADER'S MESSAGE

### Welcome to the summer edition of Redbridge Life



Cllr Jas Athwal recently met with local artist Yasmin Falahat to help restart the SPACE public art programme at Redbridge Town Hall, alongside local residents Hassan, and Eric Garcia.

#### Dear residents,

I've lived in Redbridge for over 50 years and one of the best things about our area is our fantastic, bustling high streets.

We have a thriving local economy made up of big brand retailers but more importantly, independent shops and cafes which, thanks to the strong entrepreneurial spirit of our local communities, make our high streets unique.

The last year has been incredibly hard on local businesses, with shops and cafes having to shut their doors during successive lockdowns and when open, adapt to new COVID-19 safety measures.

Throughout the pandemic our council has worked hard to support local businesses as much as possible, administering thousands of pounds worth of grants and helping implement COVID-19 safety measures including distance stickers and track and trace signs.

We are committed to continuing to support our high streets through the recovery and over the summer we will be stepping up this essential work. We will be making improvements to the appearance of our high streets across the borough and helping our traders to do the same. This includes fresh plants and planters, festive lights, artwork and grants to enable retailers to revamp their shop fronts if they want to.

This summer we can all play our part by staying and shopping local, not just to prevent the spread of COVID-19, but also to show our support for local shops and businesses and make the most of the wonderful parks and green spaces we have in Redbridge.

Recently I met talented local artist Yasmin Falahat who is helping to restart the SPACE public art programme at Redbridge Town Hall and created the new beautiful artwork on display outside SPACE studios. We hope to see many new creative installations popping up in Ilford to support our plans to bring together art, music and drama to create a cultural quarter in our town centre. And through our partner, Vision, we will be hosting several exciting summer events – details of which you can find on pages 18-21.

As a council we still have work to do to address key issues in our borough. We know just how important it is to feel safe on our streets and that's why, as you will see on page 9, we have appointed Barnardo's Chief Executive Dr Javed Khan OBE as the Chair of the new Community Crime Commission.

Many of you have shared your views on how and where improvements can be made so people feel safer when living, working or travelling in Redbridge. We want to take all your ideas on board and make a real difference and I'm so pleased Dr Khan will be leading this important work.


So, despite a difficult year in Redbridge we still have much to celebrate, much to be proud of, and much to look forward to.

# New homes offer a better future in the borough

### Studio flats support rough sleepers back into independent living



### Leader of Redbridge Council, Cllr Jas Athwal, said:

"We are committed to creating much needed, high quality and affordable homes, and to ending rough sleeping in the borough. Between them, these two new schemes are cutting the waiting time for accommodation, offering a better future for local families and providing a long-term legacy of support to those unfortunate enough to have been made homeless."

A former care home in Ilford has been transformed into 18 new self-contained, high needs supported homes for local rough sleepers.

The Ryedale scheme, in Ilford Lane, provides 'ready to move in' studio homes on two-year leases with additional support from specialist staff.

The aim is to help individuals move towards independent living.

The first residents moved into their new homes during April 2021, with all the flats now occupied.

## First residents get the keys to new council homes in Marlyon Road

Thirty three new, high quality council homes in Marlyon Road, Hainault have helped cut the waiting time for accommodation for local families in need of an affordable home.

The first residents were handed the keys to five two-bedroom and 28 one-bedroom new homes during May 2021.

The development is part of our commitment to build 600 new, permanent, affordable homes by 2022.

A second phase of the development will see 48 more new affordable council homes added, with eight specifically designed for wheelchair users.

# ENGIE to deliver three more affordable housing projects across Redbridge

Following the success of Old Mill Court and the first phase of Marlyon Road, ENGIE is pleased to be delivering another 84 homes within the borough. The three projects, all of which are starting in July 2021, will see much needed affordable housing delivered to the council.

The first project, Avenue Court, will see 27 brand new homes with balconies and shared amenity space. The new homes include 10 flats within two new blocks, two bungalows and 15 flats as part of rooftop extensions on existing buildings. Heathcote & Glade Court will also be developed to offer 33 new homes in the form of 14 one-bed, eight two-bed, six three-bed and five four-bed properties.

Finally, Shakespeare Square will include eight one-bedroom, six two-bedroom, seven three-bedroom and three four-bedroom flats.

The flats will be spread across two four-storey blocks and one five-storey block as well as a mansard roof extension, (a roof with two pitches on each side which is a way of adding extra space, effectively adding an extra floor), which will contain four residential flats.

At ENGIE, we understand that some of the builds will be in close proximity to residents in occupation, but we are committed to open communication and minimising disruption. We have employed a resident liaison officer who will introduce themselves to all residents affected before the build begins and will be a support throughout the construction phases.

These are exciting new developments for Redbridge, and we look forward to helping many more people move into affordable housing.

Young people from across the borough have identified their priorities for the Child Friendly Redbridge programme, as part of our journey towards recognition as a UNICEF UK Child Friendly Community.

We are now busy working to address these priorities. The council and its partners will seek to tackle issues raised by young people around harassment faced by young women, accessing help and support for young people experiencing mental health issues and climate change. We are also working with the police on how we help create safer routes to schools.

# Help us protect women and girls from violence in Redbridge

Our borough needs to be a safe place for everyone. All women and girls who live, work or visit Redbridge should always feel safe – whether they are walking down one of our high streets, using public transport or visiting a park.

### We are taking steps to make Redbridge a safer place by:

- establishing a Redbridge Crime Commission to investigate and address the root causes of crime
- signing up to the Mayor's Women's Night Safety Charter
- appointing a Women's Champion for Redbridge, Cllr Saima Ahmed
- inviting thousands of women and girls across the borough to share their views and experiences, through two 'Women's Safety' surveys and a series of online listening events.

From these conversations, it's clear that many women and girls in Redbridge feel unsafe at home, on the street and online. Working alongside the Police, Transport for London, British Transport Police and our community partners, we are determined to hold individuals to account, invest in improvements to make our neighbourhoods safer and work alongside communities to challenge inappropriate behaviour.

Street harassment can be defined as any unwanted verbal, non-verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature. This includes but is not limited to:

- staring
- · unwanted gestures
- catcalling
- · sexually suggestive comments
- · following someone
- · indecent exposure.

Our vision is to make Redbridge a great place for people to live, work and visit. The results of the survey and listening events will be used to target local resources and action in the areas that will have the biggest impact on women's safety. We will share these with you in the next edition of Redbridge Life. Together, we can all make Redbridge safer for women and girls.

#### Cllr Saima Ahmed, said:

"This is such an important piece of work that needs to be at the forefront of not only our safety policy but our advancement for equality.

We really need to understand the issues that affect women and girls in Redbridge so we can provide effective and meaningful solutions to ensure they feel safe whether that be in the home, at work, or in the community. I look forward to this new journey, and hope I can make a difference in our area."

A new independent Community Crime Commission is aiming to cut crime across the borough. The panel, made up of experts and local community leaders, is being led by Dr Javed Khan OBE, Chief Executive of the Barnardo's charity. As well as leading Barnado's, Dr Javed Khan OBE advises the government and local authorities in a range of areas and was recently recognised for his work with an OBE.

The commission board will select its priorities through a mix of feedback from communities, local crime statistics and the impact of a crime on its victims. It will then make a series of recommendations on how to tackle these crimes and reduce their root causes.

### Dr Javed Khan OBE said:

"I am very excited to be leading such an innovative committee, tackling the types of crime that Redbridge residents tell us concern them the most. This is one of several ground-breaking projects underway within Redbridge Council, aiming to cut crime and its causes. I couldn't be prouder to be so directly involved within one of them."



### Jas Athwal, Leader of the council, explains why the new CCC is so beneficial for residents:

**66** Establishing a Community Crime Commission has been a priority of mine and I'm glad to see that we have accomplished another milestone.

I want the people of Redbridge to have a say in how we tackle crime in the borough and involving experts and local leaders is a great way to ensure we are engaging with the community.

They are the first recipients of the 'Honorary Freedom of Redbridge for 19 years!




We now intend to make this a permanent feature, as we want to showcase the strength of our communities and thank individuals for their outstanding work and commitment to helping others.

### **Cleaner streets**

Waste is stored more securely. No more leaving sacks of rubbish out for collection, which get ripped open by foxes and litter the street.



# Protects crews from injury

Wheelie bins are safer for our crews and reduce risks, including sharp object injuries from handling black sacks.



### **Saves money**

We collect 22 million sacks of household waste a year, and £18m of Council Tax payers' money goes on disposing it. Less waste, and more recycling means more money put back into services that are important to you.



### Increased recycling


# Stops dishonest businesses taking advantage of your service







Water sports available at one of Redbridge's most popular outdoor locations include rowing boat hire, sailing, canoeing, kayaking and paddle boarding.


Group tuition is available for schools, families or groups of friends.

# Food glorious food will be coming from Mercato soon

Construction of Mercato Metropolitano (MM) in the heart of Ilford's new cultural quarter is now close to completion, with the community food market set to launch in late summer 2021. To date, over half of the sustainable timber frame has been built and by the beginning of September internal fit-out is expected to be complete.

MM has already engaged with local artists from neighbouring SPACE Ilford to create artwork that will initially be displayed around the construction site and later moved within the market, when it opens. Ahead of the big opening, a 'DreaMM' branded campaign will give Redbridge food and drink entrepreneurs the chance to trade within Mercato Ilford. The competition will be run by the MM team alongside Redbridge Cultural Consortium and other local organisations.

### MM's CEO, Andrea Rasca, said:

"We at MM are heavily focused on creating a global movement to engage with local communities' residents and improve food accessibility, support local culture, and foster conviviality. Our Ilford project is a one of strategic importance for us".

### Cllr Jas Athwal, Leader of Redbridge council, said:

"This project and the SPACE Ilford art studios are helping to regenerate Ilford by transforming space in the town centre into a vibrant market and art studio. These are both huge opportunities for the local economy, as they bring new jobs and businesses.

"MM Ilford and SPACE Ilford are both part of the Good Growth Fund (GGF) regeneration project known as "The Spark" that was developed with the Greater London Authority (GLA) to kick-start our longer-term ambitions for Ilford town centre."

An overwhelming number of local entrepreneurs and London food operators have already enquired about trading within the market.







We're currently undertaking a major expansion of **Wanstead Leisure Centre** near Wanstead Station to provide a **25-meter length swimming pool** with **new changing rooms**, and a **new dance studio** to complement the existing gym, badminton and squash facilities. The work is due to be completed in late 2022.

This exciting scheme is providing both a new swimming pool for the leisure centre and major improvements to Wanstead High School, which shares the same location as the leisure centre. The school will benefit from a **new teaching block**, **dining hall and kitchen space**.

### Gants Hill research launch

Local residents, the Gants Hill Community Hubs team and University College London are launching a community research project to explore 'people and place' in Gants Hill, and to shape the future Gants Hill Community Hub.

Local volunteer researchers will be finding out more about Gants Hill and those who live, work and play across the area in the coming months. Residents will be designing the community research project with Redbridge Council and UCL University.

## Both wards, which had empty seats, were won by Labour party candidates.




Pushpita Gupta, 50 was elected to represent Seven Kings ward after receiving 40% of the vote.

# £100k fine for illegal home conversion in Ilford

An unscrupulous landlord who illegally converted a family home into flats has been fined £100,000.

The owner of the property in Staines Road, Ilford, was subject of an investigation by Redbridge Council's Planning Enforcement Team due to the substandard conversion, and an unauthorised subdivision into separate flats without planning permission.

The owner was issued with fines totalling £100,000, made up of a confiscation order of £86,488, a fine of £4,000 and costs of £9,427.
