The sessions are open to everyone, no appointment necessary, and are a good way to find out what support is available for you and your family.

Whether you need advice on benefits, employment, housing, or support managing debt, we're here to help.

In addition to our drop-in events, we're also running larger marketplace style support sessions every three months.

Our Marketplace events bring together a whole host of council services and organisations from across Redbridge to provide support and advice for local people.





Defeating car thieves

Thieves are on the lookout for unsecured cars – don't let them catch you out.

Parts of England have seen an increase in motor vehicle crimes, including car thefts and thefts of items from cars. As a council, we're continuing to work with our police partners to support efforts to crack down on car crime.

Follow these tips to help keep your car safe:

- Invest in a decent steering lock.
- Invest in a good immobiliser and tracker.
- Keep your keys in a signal blocker to prevent keyless car theft.
- Always lock your car.
- Park in a well-lit area or install lighting on your driveway.



Cllr Khaver Chowdhury, **Cabinet Member for Enforcement and Community Safety, said:**

"Our council has invested £1.5 million in new ANPR cameras and an upgraded CCTV network which is providing police with vital intelligence to help tackle crime across Redbridge. Help us deter thieves by keeping your car as safe as possible."

> As well as providing the perfect day out for hungry visitors, Ilford MM will help boost local employment by directly employing 16 members of staff and creating space for local trading partners to sell their wares. Overall, it is expected that Ilford MM will create around 100 local jobs.

The market opening was initially delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but will now open in the summer so local people can enjoy the season with fresh, delicious food and drinks right in the heart of llford.



The King's Coronation

Thousands of local people celebrated the coronation of His Majesty King Charles III at events across the borough.

The coronation of His Majesty King Charles III sparked celebrations across Redbridge as thousands of local people partied in style to welcome our new sovereign.

An estimated 20,000 local people joined street parties and events across Redbridge to celebrate the coronation. Nearly 100 street parties were staged around the borough, where neighbours celebrated the historic occasion with music, performances, and delicious food and drink.

Two huge community events also took place over the bank holiday, with the Inllford entertainment extravaganza on the Saturday drawing crowds of thousands with live performances, a zip line through the town centre, and two Big Coronation Lunch <u>sittings ser</u>ving over 300 people.

On the Sunday, the entertainment moved to Wanstead, where local people enjoyed the sunshine at a Coronation Festival on Christchurch Green, featuring a children's costume competition, free pantomime performances, an array of arts and crafts stalls, and fairground rides.

"It was wonderful to join so many of my neighbours celebrating the coronation across our borough.

"There is such a strong sense of community spirit all across Redbridge. At the street parties, I heard so many inspiring stories of roads forming WhatsApp groups to help their neighbours during the pandemic – these acts of kindness led to blossoming communities and close friendships, culminating in creating these community events.

"As a council, we want to continue to support local people to build communities and organise celebrations, so we're looking into supporting a programme of annual summer street parties so neighbours can meet each other, children can play in their streets, and we can all enjoy the benefits of living in close-knit, caring communities."

Local school children help create a greener borough

Our popular School's Tree Planting project led to 1,340 local school children helping create a greener Redbridge.

Partnership projects power up Redbridge's EV network

The move follows transport being identified as one of the largest sources of carbon emissions in our borough, making it a key area for action in tackling climate change for a cleaner, greener, and healthier Redbridge.





Some important things to remember if you have a dog:

Don't allow your dog to bark constantly. As well as upsetting your neighbours, it's also a sign of a badly trained or unhappy dog. If your dog barks too much, get advice from a dog trainer.



We're supercharging Redbridge's electric vehicle network by boosting the borough's on-street EV charging points, to help local people make greener travel choices.

Atik Zaman from Gants Hill, said:

"I love my cars and was a complete petrol head, but you get to a point in your life where you start thinking about how your

actions will impact the type of future your children will have. The climate crisis played a big part in my choice to move to electric as it meant I'd no longer be polluting the air with harmful carbon dioxide from my vehicle."



Thanks to two separate partnership projects, nearly 500 new on-street EV charging points are being installed in the borough.

The boost will give local people without the ability to charge on a driveway the confidence to make the switch from petrol or diesel vehicles to electric, knowing they can easily charge an EV using the growing number of public charging points available across Redbridge.

174 fast chargers

In a landmark project with Uber, 174 fast chargers will be installed for public use at 87 locations around the borough by the end of March 2024.

310 lamp-post chargers

Thanks to funding secured from the Office for Zero Emission Vehicles, 310 public use lamp post chargers will be installed in the borough, with resident feedback helping determine the locations.

Calling all dog lovers – let's keep our parks clean and safe

Redbridge is home to thousands of dog lovers, from Dachshund dads to Maltipoo mums, we all agree dogs are a part of the family.

Help keep our parks and green spaces safe for our furry friends and all other visitors by following the rules and being a responsible dog parent.

Make sure your dog is microchipped and wears a collar with an ID tag in public places. Both of these are legal requirements and failure to do so could lead to a fine.

Train your dog in obedience and make sure your dog is under control at all times.

Register your dog with a vet and take it for regular check-ups.

When walking your dog, keep bags on you so you can pick up after your pooch and dispose of the dog waste.

Dog Control Public Space Protection Order (PSPO):

To help keep Redbridge a safe and pleasant space for all, we have a Dog Control PSPO in place. Breaching the PSPO is an offence for which you can be fined or prosecuted.

Under the PSPO dogs are:

- Not permitted in certain spaces in the borough.
- Required to be kept on a lead in areas where the Order applies.
- Required to be placed on a lead when directed to by an authorised officer in areas where the PSPO applies.
- 😽 To be kept to no more than six dogs per person in areas where the Order applies.
- Not allowed to foul on land under the Order. It is an offence if you fail to clear up after your dog.

Exploring the Rich History of our Borough

A History of Royalty in Redbridge

Millions of people across the country celebrated the coronation of King Charles III over the bank holiday weekend in May, including lots of local people who hosted street parties and attended events in Ilford Town Centre.

Let's look back into our local history to see how Royal fever has swept across Redbridge in the past.

When Princess Elizabeth was crowned Queen at her coronation on 2 June 1953, street parties were held all around the borough and a special tea party was held for children.

© Mrs Curtis Redbridge Museum & Heritage Centre On 6 February 1977, The Queen celebrated her Silver Jubilee, which marked 25 years since her accession to the throne. Buses on Ilford's No. 25 route were painted silver and street parties were held all over the borough to celebrate the Silver Jubilee.



King Charles III came to Redbridge in 1978 when he was the Prince of Wales. He visited the former Plessey Factory, the communications manufacturer, in Ilford in October 1978, arriving by helicopter to onlookers' delight.

King Charles III, formerly The Prince of Wales, was in Redbridge as part of a programme designed to acquaint him with developments in British industry. He met with a range of employees at a buffet lunch. The visit was kept largely private, but despite efforts to keep it low-key the royal was met with excited crowds outside of the Plessey Factory. In 2002, The Queen celebrated her Golden Jubilee, marking 50 years on the throne. Her Majesty and the Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Phillip, visited Wanstead to meet volunteers on an allotment project, which supported people with learning difficulties. The Royal couple were met by cheering crowds waving homemade banners and flags. To mark the special occasion, Redbridge Town Hall unveiled a Golden Jubilee themed civic artwork and a plaque. Redbridge Council provided every local school pupil with a commemorative coin as a keepsake of the special day.

The Queen returned in 2012 on her Diamond Jubilee tour. She visited the wonderfully restored Valentines Mansion and Gardens, where she unveiled a plaque and officially opened a new 'dry weather' garden which was installed as a response to climate change.

The Queen and Prince Phillip then visited the 'London Pride' art and design festival held at the Mansion produced by Vision RCL and Redbridge Council. This featured famous British artwork from the Tate, including work by Damien Hirst and Lucian Freud, as well as artwork by local people and a special display by Redbridge Museum. Gathered crowds of local people gave such a joyful welcome that a Royal expert said The Queen had "rarely looked happier."

Redbridge Institute of Adult Education celebrates transforming one million lives

The celebrations to mark 120 years of adult education in Redbridge continue, as Redbridge Institute of Adult Education rolls out roadshows across the borough to raise awareness of part-time courses on offer, most of which are free for eligible adults.

So far over 5,000 local people have taken advantage of the opportunity to discuss what's on offer at the Redbridge Institute of Adult Education, including upskilling, retraining, or gaining a gualification.

The only local authority adult education provider in London to be rated 'Outstanding' by Ofsted, Redbridge Institute enrols around 4,000 adult learners on daytime, evening, weekend and online courses every year.

It is estimated that one million local people have enrolled on courses since the institute opened its doors in 1903. You can view the history of adult education by visiting our exhibition at Redbridge Central Library until the end of July.

Principal William Pickford, says:

"We know the transformative power of adult education and, as part of our 120th anniversary celebrations, we want even more of our neighbours to benefit from the opportunities available."



Learner Helen Tkachenko and her family came from Ukraine as refugees. She explained:

"Coming to the UK was very hard, I had to start my life again from zero. Redbridge Institute was really helpful, I found a lot of friends on my course and my tutor created a positive atmosphere.

"Now my English has really improved, I have a job and I feel like part of the community."

Cllr Mark Santos, Cabinet Member for Adult Social Care and Health, said:



"The Institute is an incredibly welcoming space with wonderful teachers, so if you're looking to learn a language, improve your employability, or simply meet new people, why not visit one of the roadshow events or look online at their website today."

Business is booming in Redbridge

Redbridge is a hub for entrepreneurship, home to a growing number of small, medium and micro businesses, attracted to what is becoming the heart of modern East London.

Our council is investing in our high streets and town centres to make sure they continue to attract thriving businesses, and offer everything local people need to shop closer to home.



A bright spark for **local entrepreneurs**

Last year Spark Lab opened in Ilford, a new innovative space for local entrepreneurs looking to kick-start their businesses. The Deco Building (formerly Dorothy Perkins) was converted into an exciting new space for enterprises, makers, creators and innovators to share their passion and skills with local shoppers and visitors.



The old Dorothy Perkins building is now home to local budding businesses.

A group of artists and entrepreneurs were selected to occupy the space, each of which was given a six-week residency period between May 2022 and April 2023. Their activities created jobs and volunteering opportunities for local people, and included workshops, exhibitions, pop up retail activities, art and small fashion shows.

Running alongside the Spark Lab residencies, the Redbridge Business Team delivered business advice sessions on topics including digital marketing for budding entrepreneurs and new business owners.

Tough on Sexist Street Harassment



Sexist harassment is against the law and our teams are on the lookout for offenders.

Redbridge Council has made no secret of our ambition to ensure that all women and girls can feel safe in our borough. And from June, our new campaign highlights the role our police and enforcement teams are taking to stamp out sexist harassment.

Cat-calling, unwanted touching and sexist comments are in the spotlight as our new campaign, ThisHasToStop, sets out the penalty for men who harass women on our streets.

This summer, in key locations across the borough, local people will see the faces of police and Council officers tasked with stopping and fining men who threaten women's safety. In a series of uncompromising images, police and enforcement officers pin-point the kinds of offences that are liable to a £100 fixed fine – or even court action.



Launching the initiative Cllr Saima Ahmed, Redbridge Council's Women's Safety Champion, said:

"For too long there has been a

perception that these behaviours are playful and cause no harm. But women have told us that unwanted attention of this sort is humiliating, leaving many in fear. The message is clear: This Has To Stop."

ThisHasToStop is a multi-approach by our council and partners to tackle misogyny and male violence against women and girls. Community safety teams at the Council have reviewed the evidence about what works in stopping sexist behaviours. Research points to the need to challenge perpetrators as well as to increase the confidence of women and bystanders.


Future plans will increase awareness of the link between 'everyday sexism' and more serious sexual crimes and will be rolled out over this summer.

Have you been a victim? Do you experience harassment?

The police are piloting a new tool that allows women to anonymously report locations where they feel unsafe. The form is quick and easy to use and the police use these reports to target uniformed patrols in those areas.

What are PSPOs?

Public Space Protection Orders give powers to Local Authorities in areas where the quality of life is undermined by detrimental activities and behaviours.

The whole of Redbridge is covered by such an order, meaning that officers – including police and council enforcement teams – can issue Fixed Penalty Notices to those committing a breach. If the offender fails to pay the £100 fine this can be followed up by court action and a fine of over £1,000.

PSPO offences include behaviours that cause, or are likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to another person. This includes cat-calling, making sexist remarks and persistent following.


Celebrating the history of Gants Hill

A stunning book of photographs that depict the transformation of Gants Hill from farmland to busy commuter suburb has just been published by The History Press.

The book, which details life in the area from the early 1900s onwards, has been compiled by local businessman and founder of the Gants Hill Facebook Group, Vincent Goodman, and lecturer and President of the Ilford Historical Society, Jef Page.

Vincent, a graphic designer who has owned Speedprint in Gants Hill since 1983, has been collecting professional and amateur photos of the area for decades. Many tell stories of the people, businesses and landmarks he grew up with, including a photo of three girls taken outside the cinema around 1958, which Jennifer Havnes gave permission for Vincent and Jef to use in the book.

Jennifer, who now lives in Canada, remembers the occasion clearly. "My two sisters, Veronica with the rabbit and Amanda with her toy monkey, and me attended the children's Saturday Morning Pictures each week at the Odeon. This was 'bring your pet week' and we dutifully gathered outside the cinema with our pets!"

"Everyone deserves a safe and comfortable place to call home. After decades of underbuilding, London is in the throes of a housing crisis and local families are suffering. Right now, the waiting list for a council house is so long, families are waiting decades for a home of their own.

I felt down but my Advisor Prasanna always boosted my confidence. He said I have 21 years of experience and some people don't have half my skills.

"I felt like the world had moved on and left me behind. I felt like a dinosaur, with one foot in the 20th Century. I applied for a job with Vision RCL as a Kitchen Assistant. When I got the job, I couldn't believe it. I was emotional. They said they really liked me. After a 20 minute chat, they had already decided. It made me feel good.

"When I was in Malaysia the pandemic hit and I couldn't return as everything was shut down. When I finally returned to the UK, I didn't have a job, but I wanted to give back to the community. I looked for opportunities on the Redbridge CVS website. At first, I volunteered in Valentines Park. It was a great way to meet lots of people from different ages and backgrounds. Then I started volunteering two days a week with the Salvation Army's Malachi Place Project. It's a supported accommodation hostel with 42 rooms for people without a home.

"I organised lots of activities such as painting, table tennis, and boardgames like Ludo with the clients. Sometimes we would go to the park with clients and there were movie nights too, I even took part in a 7-a-side football tournament in Manchester.

Community Grocery Store opens in Ilford

A Community Grocery Store recently opened in Ilford to help local families struggling with rising food costs.

The store, in City Gates Church, Clements Road, works on a membership system, so families can join up for only £5 and then access a wide range of affordable supermarket products for only £4 per visit, saving on average £20 per shop.

As well as making sure local people have access to affordable groceries, the store also offers wrap-around support, with staff on hand to signpost to other services available to help with rising bills or financial difficulty.

Set up by international charity The Message Trust in partnership with City Gates Church, with support from Redbridge Council, the store has already proved extremely popular, with over 500 people signing up within weeks.

Sebastian would like more people to try volunteering:

"It's rewarding to give back to the community. Volunteering can be an eye-opening experience. We see homelessness on the street every day, we see alcohol addiction and we walk past. There is another side of the story, we only judge by what we see. By volunteering, we see what they went through. It's about not judging and being there for them. It can happen to any of us, I have learnt a lot. The other volunteers talk to clients, to make them feel like they are human too.

"If you have a few hours to spend volunteering, it's worth trying. If you don't try in life, you will never know."

Work is underway at Wanstead Swimming Pool

Family business begins new phase of Wanstead swimming pool construction.

Local East London family-run business, Jerram Falkus, has taken over construction of the new swimming pool and expanded Leisure Centre in Wanstead. Work is underway on site to deliver the new and improved centre in addition to 14 new classrooms, a new dining room, and kitchen at Wanstead High School.

Jerram Falkus was founded in 1884 and has delivered projects across London, including the prestigious Hintze Hall in the Natural History Museum – the largest public gallery in the museum. Following the Second World War, the company spent 30 years building new houses, schools, hospitals, factories, and offices in London and the home counties.

Once completed, the updated Wanstead Leisure Centre will be home to a 25-metre swimming pool, with six swimming lanes open for everyone to enjoy, with both membership and pay-as-youswim options.

The new swimming pool will join a dance studio space, and complement the existing gym, badminton and squash courts.





EKOTA Academy and Brothers on Bikes are offering free cycle training for local young people at a new City Hub in Goodmayes Park, thanks to support from Redbridge Council, The Mayor of London's Walking and Cycling Grant and British Cycling. The community City Hubs are part of the British Cycling City Academy project, a Rapha Foundation funded project, to identify and support riders to make cycling more accessible and representative of the local community. All City Hub sessions are free and are run by local community coaches and delivered in communal spaces.

Since the launch in Goodmayes Park in April, children ages seven and above can access cycle coaching for free. Bikes are available to borrow for the sessions, removing one common barrier to access. The sessions enable young people to improve their health, meet new friends and
