Action on fly-tipping

We all want our streets to be clean and tidy. We have increased the on-the-spot fine for anyone caught fly-tipping, or having their rubbish fly-tipped to £1000.



Woodford police hub

A police hub will open soon in Woodford, giving a base to community policing teams, and bringing council services into the community.

New homes for local people

We continue to build affordable social housing for local people to rent.

11,000 potholes fixed in the borough this year




Investing in safety


Preventing flooding

We have invested in new technology including drain sensors, to help us monitor water levels and reduce the risk of flooding.



Hainault Forest Country Park

Our historic forest has been restored for generations to come, with a new visitor centre and cafe, accessible paving, and additional furry friends now resident in the refurbished Foxburrow's Farm. The brand new playground boasts the longest slide in the borough.



Valentines Park Lido

A new lido is planned for Valentines park; the latest in a series of affordable new outdoor leisure facilities for everyone to enjoy, from Hainault to Ilford.

Loxford Youth Centre refurbished

The centre is now home to a music studio, classrooms, a multi-use games area, an outdoor gym, and a production kitchen.

Community store with affordable groceries

For £5 annual membership, local people can visit the community grocery store in Ilford and can fill their basket for just £5 each time they visit.

Having lost around 54% of Government Grant Settlement Funding since 2010, councils across the country are in a difficult financial position. We are the third-lowest funded London borough, per head. Despite this, we always rise to the challenge of keeping vital services running in Redbridge, and investing in what matters most to local people.

This year a typical band D property will pay **21p** more per day to the Council, which will be invested in the following services:
