

## 2011 Census – Key Statistics tables and Quick Statistics tables Ward and Lower Super Output Area level

# ECONOMY

## Introduction

As the second phase of the [second release of 2011 Census statistics](#) the [Office for National Statistics](#) (ONS) has now published:

- 35 Key Statistics tables for wards and output areas (*summary figures, presented as both numbers and percentages, to allow comparison across different areas*).
- 70 Quick Statistics tables for wards and output areas (*refer to one variable and its response categories from a census question*).
- Data at ward and lower layer super output area level (*geographic area containing circa 1,500 people*) is now available for the first time on topics such as ethnicity, religion, health, household composition and economic activity.

This briefing focuses on the theme of economy and, where possible, compares Redbridge data against 2001 Census data and/or the London average. The briefing also sets out links to more detailed data sets and a schedule of future data releases.

Due to small population size, City of London is not included in any London average calculations, or in London rankings. This leaves a total of 32 London Boroughs and 624 London wards in the ranking scale. Nationally there are 8,562 wards.

## Key findings

### Residents aged between 16 and 74 years

- At 67.1%, Loxford was in the lowest two per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years.

***Note that percentages are of the usually resident population aged between 16 and 74 years.***

### Full-time employment

- At 26.0%, Loxford ranked amongst the lowest two per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents who were in full-time employment.
- Church End (49.3%) and Snaresbrook (46.8%) had the highest proportions of residents in Redbridge who were in full-time employment and were the only two Redbridge wards to see an increase between the censuses.

### Unemployment

- Every ward in Redbridge saw an increase between the 2001 and 2011 censuses in the proportion of residents who were unemployed.
- Loxford (8.1%) ranked highest in Redbridge and was in the highest five per cent of London wards for the proportion of residents who were unemployed. Loxford also ranked fourth highest of all London wards for the proportion of residents who had never worked (2.7%), was just outside the highest five per cent for the proportion of residents who were long-term unemployed (3.2%) and was within the highest seven per cent for the proportion of residents aged 16 to 24 years who were unemployed (1.8%).
- At 1.3%, Valentines was in the highest three per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged 50 to 74 years who were unemployed.
- At 66.8% and 64.9% respectively, Loxford and Clementswood ranked fifth and eighth highest of all London wards for the proportion of lone parent households with dependent children where the lone parent was not in employment.
- At 15.3%, Loxford ranked second highest of all London wards for the proportion of households with dependent children where no adults were in employment.

### Looking after home/family

- At 10.1% and 9.9% respectively, Loxford and Clementswood ranked second and fourth highest of all London wards for the proportion of residents who were economically inactive as they were looking after their home/family.

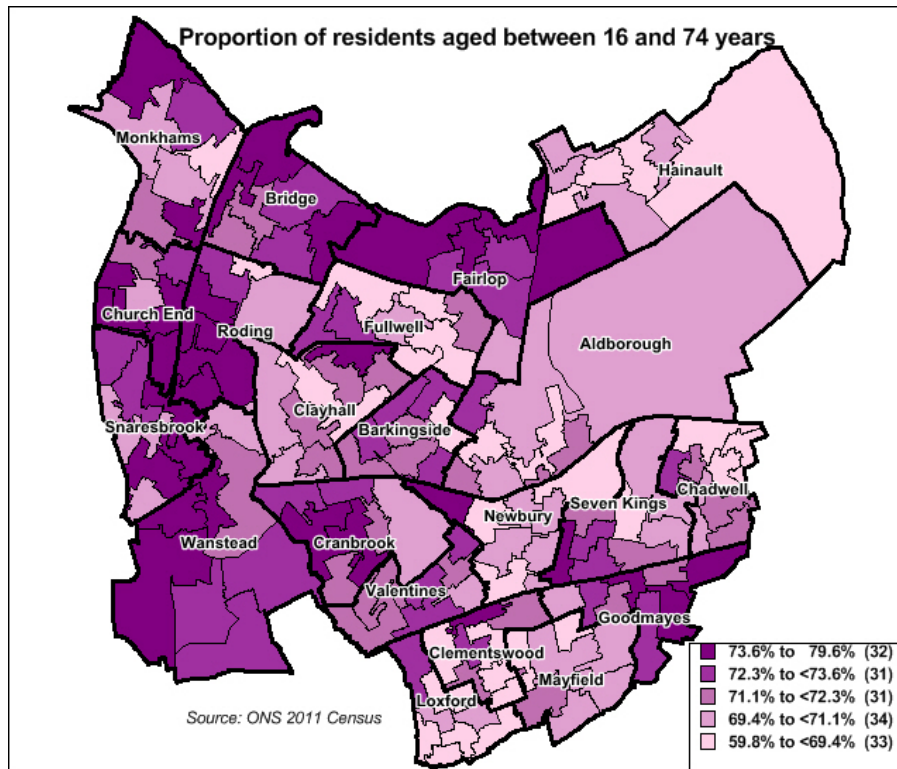
### Permanently sick/disabled

- At 6.6%, Hainault was amongst the highest three per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents who were economically inactive due to being permanently sick or disabled.

## Proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years

At 71.5%, Redbridge had the third lowest proportion of all London Boroughs of residents aged between 16 and 74 years. Whilst the London average had increased by almost one percentage point between the 2001 and 2011 censuses (from 73.9% to 74.8%), the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years in Redbridge had decreased very slightly from 71.8%. At 67.1%, Loxford was within the lowest two per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years – Church End (75.5%) had the highest proportion in Redbridge. The table to the right provides a breakdown of the change in each ward – *please note, percentages may not sum due to rounding.*

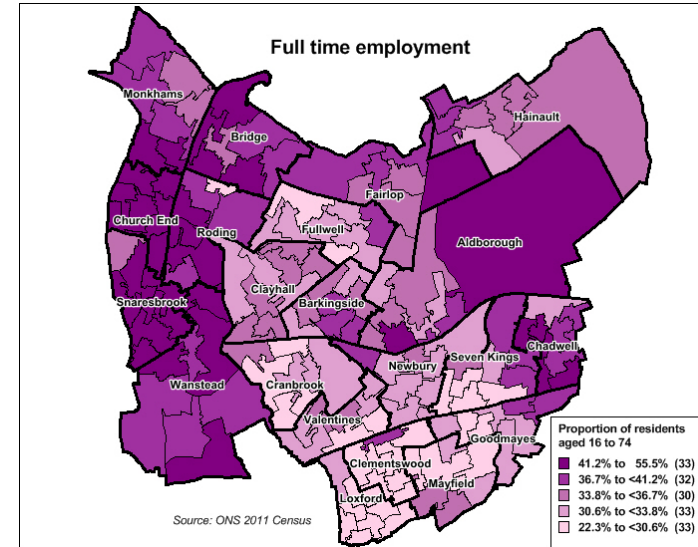

## Full-time employment

Full-time employment in Redbridge decreased by nearly five percentage points between the 2001 and 2011 censuses (from 40.5% to 35.9%) – we were ranked fifth lowest of all London Boroughs and were nearly four percentage points lower than the London average (39.8%). At the same time in Redbridge part-time employment increased by nearly two and a half percentage points (from 9.6% to 12.0%) and self-employment increased by more than two percentage points (from 9.6% to 11.7%).

At 26.0%, Loxford ranked amongst the lowest two per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who were in full-time employment – Church End (49.3%) and Snaresbrook (46.8%) had the highest proportions in Redbridge and were the only two wards to have seen an increase between the censuses.

The map to the right shows the proportion of residents at LSOA level aged between 16 and 74 years who were in full-time employment.

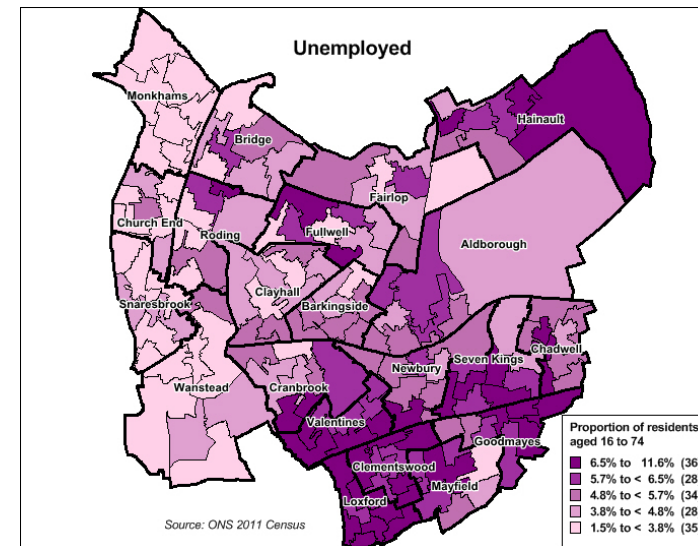


## Unemployment

Unemployment in Redbridge increased by nearly two percentage points between the censuses (from 3.6% to 5.3%) – we were ranked fifteenth highest of all London Boroughs and were slightly higher than the London average (5.2%).

At 8.1%, Loxford ranked in the highest five per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who were unemployed – Monkhamms (2.7%) had the lowest proportion in Redbridge and ranked amongst the lowest six per cent of all London wards. Every ward in Redbridge saw an increase between the censuses.

The map to the right shows the proportion of residents at LSOA level aged between 16 and 74 years who were unemployed.



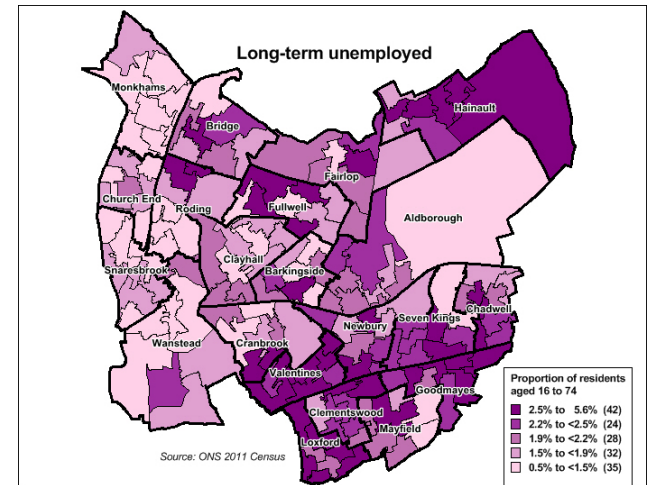
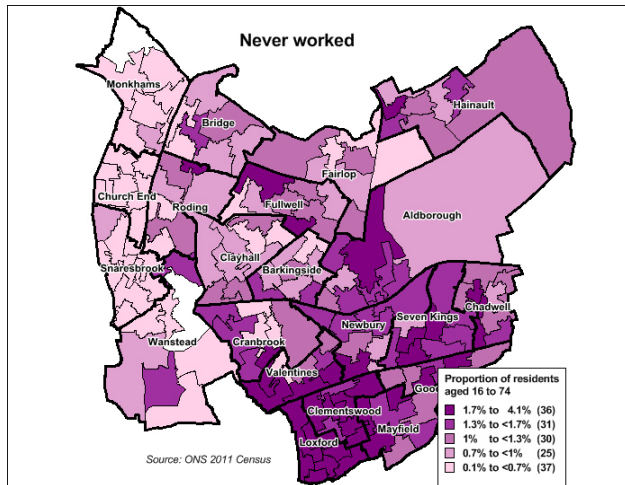
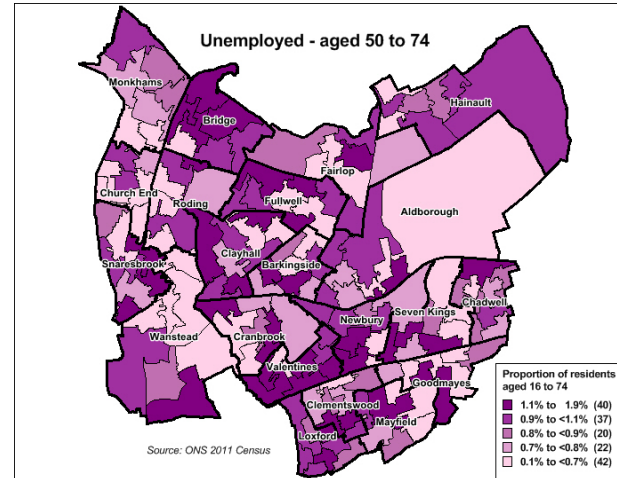
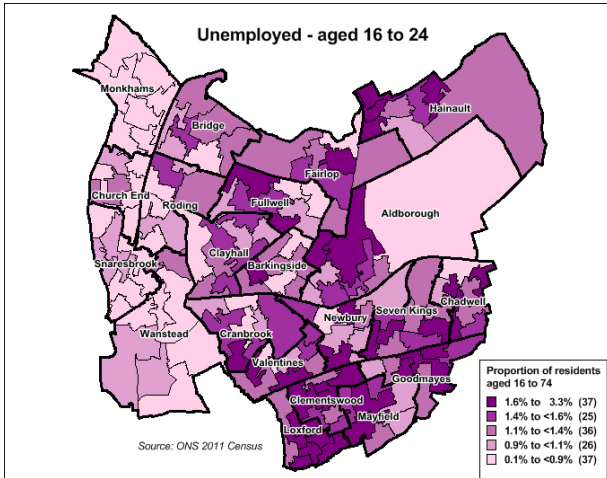

Loxford ranked fourth highest of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who had never worked (2.7%), was just outside the highest five per cent for the proportion who were long-term unemployed (3.2%) and was within the highest seven per cent for the proportion aged 16 to 24 years who were unemployed (1.8%). At 1.3%, Valentines was in the highest three per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged 50 to 74 years who were unemployed whilst Clementswood (2.1%) was in the highest five per cent for the proportion who had never worked.

## Economically inactive

The table below provides a breakdown of the change in each ward for the economically inactive categories – *please note, percentages are of the usually resident population aged between 16 and 74 years:*

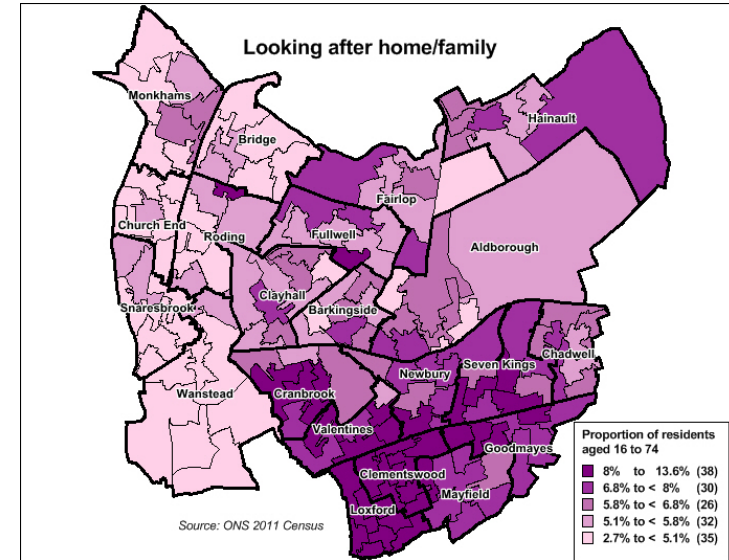

## Looking after home/family

The proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who were economically inactive due to looking after their home/family decreased in Redbridge from 7.8% to 6.6% between the censuses. In 2011, we were ranked fourth highest of all London Boroughs and exceeded the London average (5.2%).

Although each ward in Redbridge saw a decrease between the 2001 and 2011 censuses, at 10.1% and 9.9% respectively Loxford and Clementswood ranked second and fourth highest of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who were economically inactive due to looking after their home/family – Valentines and Seven Kings were also ranked in the highest four per cent of all London wards.

The map to the right shows the proportion of residents at LSOA level aged between 16 and 74 years who were economically inactive due to looking after their home/family.

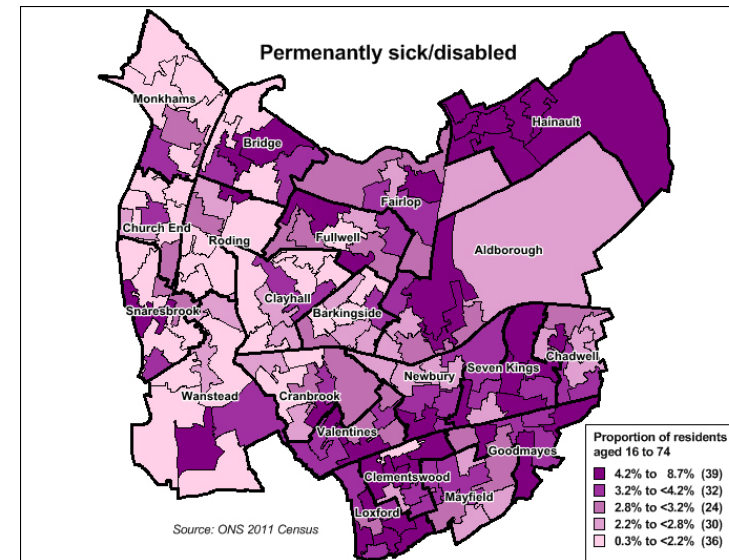


## Permanently sick/disabled

The proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who were economically inactive due to being permanently sick or disabled decreased in Redbridge from 4.4% to 3.3% between the censuses. In 2011, we were ranked twelfth lowest of all London Boroughs and were lower than the London average (3.7%).

At 6.6%, Hainault ranked amongst the highest three per cent of all London wards for the proportion of residents aged between 16 and 74 years who were economically inactive due to being permanently sick or disabled – Monkhamms (1.7%) had the lowest proportion in Redbridge. Every ward in Redbridge saw a decrease between the censuses.

The map to the right shows the proportion of residents at LSOA level aged between 16 and 74 years who were economically inactive due to being permanently sick or disabled.

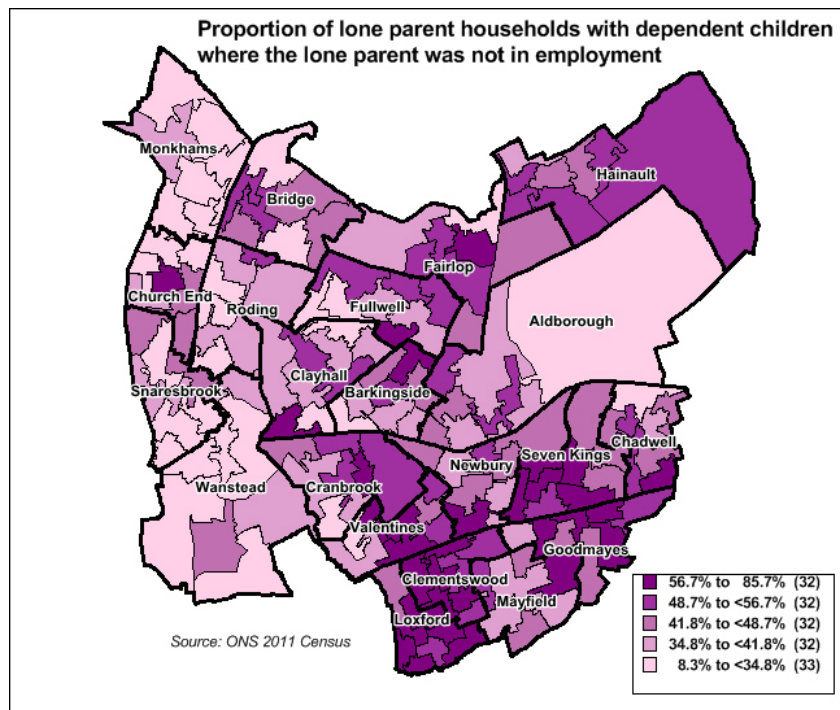


## Lone parent households with dependent children where the lone parent was not in employment

The proportion of lone parent households in Redbridge where the lone parent was not in employment decreased by seven percentage points (from 56.3% to 49.3%) between the censuses. In 2011, Redbridge was ranked eleventh highest of all London boroughs.

With the exception of Chadwell and Seven Kings, every ward in Redbridge saw a decrease between the censuses in the proportion of lone parent households with dependent children where the lone parent was not in employment – Monkams (26.3%) and Wanstead (31.0%) had the lowest proportions in Redbridge, whilst Loxford (66.8%) and Clementswood (64.9%) ranked fifth and eighth highest of all London wards. The table to the right provides a breakdown of the change in each ward – *please note, percentages may not sum due to rounding.*

The map below shows the proportion of lone parent households in Redbridge where the lone parent was not in employment at LSOA level.



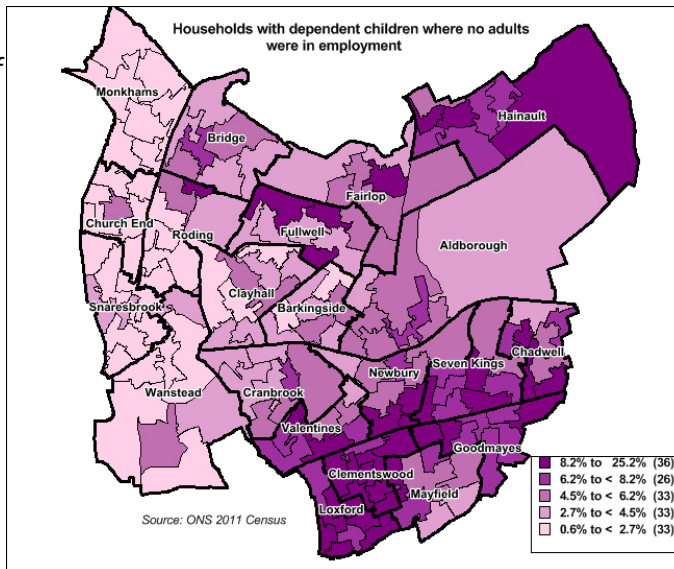

## Households where no adults were in employment

The proportion of Redbridge households with dependent children where no adults were in employment (5.9%) was slightly higher than the London average (5.7%) whilst the proportion of Redbridge households without dependent children where no adults were in employment (22.3%) was slightly lower than the London average (22.5%) – Redbridge ranked fifteenth highest of all London Boroughs for both categories.

At 15.3%, Loxford ranked second highest of all London wards for the proportion of households with dependent children where no adults were in employment – Clementswood (10.8%) was just outside of the highest five per cent of London wards. Hainault (29.1%) and Monkams (28.8%) both featured in the highest ten per cent of London wards for the proportion of households without dependent children where no adults were in employment. The table to the right provides a breakdown of the change in each ward – *please note, percentages may not sum due to rounding.*
