### Wood Burning - Are you ready to burn?

The 'Ready to Burn' label shows logs are ready for use as wood fuel.

These logs burn more efficiently than unseasoned, green wood and reduce environmental impact. Ready to Burn firewood has a moisture content less or equal to 20 per cent; using it in place of wet wood fuel is proven to reduce the levels of emissions in the air we breathe.

#### Why dry, clean wood?

- dry, Ready to Burn wood/logs and briquettes make any appliance more efficient
- burning dry wood instead of wet wood is part of the solution to reducing the impact on our environment
- burning wet wood increases emissions and has a greater impact on air quality
- any appliance and chimney system will suffer from smoke produced from wet wood, which increases maintenance and repair costs
- burning waste and treated wood (e.g. old furniture) can emit harmful fumes

#### THE SIMPLE SOLUTION

Small retail bags of firewood logs often contain wet wood - this means they are not suitable for burning without further seasoning.

Look out for retail bags of wood-fuel clearly labelled as 'Ready to Burn' by a Woodsure Certified Supplier. This helps consumers to distinguish wood that is 'Ready to Burn'.

Ready to Burn wood produces fewer harmful emissions. Redbridge is designated a Smoke Control Area so you will still need to combine it with a DEFRA Exempt wood-burning stove. A list of approved appliances is available from the DEFRA web site https://smokecontrol.defra.gov.uk/appliances.php


# Ilford Town Centre visitors back improvements, as transformation continues to take shape

Almost two-thirds of visitors to Ilford believe the town centre is improving. In a recent survey of visitors conducted by the Ilford Business Improvement District (BID), 63% of respondents agreed the town centre had improved over the last year.

The increase in positive sentiment follows improvements to the public realm such as improved paved areas, planting, and new communal areas and event spaces. The new southern entrance to Ilford Station adds a welcoming feel for visitors and the new cultural quarter adds artistic elements to the visitor experience.

The council has also recently acquired the former Dorothy Perkins / Burtons shop unit in the High Street, with plans in place to convert the space into a business and creative space for local start-ups and small businesses. The fit out is expected to be completed during spring 2022.



### RideLondon is coming to Redbridge in 2022

We're really excited to be one of the host boroughs for RideLondon 2022, the world's greatest festival of cycling.

The proposed route for next year's edition of the Olympic legacy event from London 2012 includes parts of Wanstead, Woodford and Hainault.

The 100-mile challenge ride takes place Sunday 29 May 2022, and starts in the capital, passing through Redbridge on its way out to Essex and then back down through the borough again before finishing in central London.

RideLondon has grown into a record-breaking festival of cycling enjoyed by more than 460,000 participants, from beginners to the world's best professionals.

#### Cllr Jas Athwal, Leader of the London Borough of Redbridge, said:

"The news that RideLondon will be coming to Redbridge is fantastic. With the cycling event route due to travel through the borough, we have the chance to inspire people of all ages to get pedalling, and at the same give local businesses along the course a much-needed boost.

### Protect yourself, your loved ones

With Christmas and the festive holiday season now upon us, it's vital that everyone in Redbridge eligible for vaccinations comes forward to protect themselves, their loved ones and the NHS.

Due to the colder weather and people being inside more, dangerous viruses like COVID-19 and the flu can be passed on to others more easily, experts are warning there could be a significant flu surge this winter alongside a local rise in COVID-19 cases.

#### There are three vaccinations available this winter:

- ☑ first and second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine
- **☑** COVID-19 booster vaccination
- **☑** winter flu vaccination.

Those aged 40 years and over, health and social care workers and younger people at risk who have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine can now receive their COVID-19 booster and winter flu vaccines.

If you are offered both the flu and COVID-19 booster vaccine, it's safe to have them at the same time.

## COVID-19 Booster vaccine explained

Like some other vaccines, levels of protection may begin to decrease over time.

The COVID-19 booster dose will help extend the protection gained from the first two doses and give you longer term protection.

If you are eligible, you will be offered a booster dose at least three months after your last dose of an approved COVID-19 vaccine.

#### Winter flu vaccination explained

The winter flu vaccination is offered every year on the NHS to help protect people at risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

Those who are eligible for a free flu vaccine can book an appointment through their GP surgery or local pharmacy. Many local pharmacies also offer the jab to anyone, for a cost of under £15.

To find out if you're eligible and to book your winter vaccines visit:



### Protect yourself and others now, and for the festive season ahead

- ☑ get vaccinated and take up your COVID-19 booster jab when offered
- ☑ social distance in crowded places
- wear a face covering in shops, crowded spaces and on public transport
- ☑ self-isolate when instructed to do so
- ☑ test yourself if attending an event or gathering
- ☑ if you feel unwell, stay at home
- ☑ let fresh air in if you meet indoors
- ☑ meeting outdoors is safer
- ☑ wash your hands regularly.

### Art brings disabled support group together

### for a unique exhibition

SPACE Ilford, the art gallery part-funded by Redbridge Council, recently hosted an exhibition of artwork created by One Place East, a disabled persons support group based in Ilford.

The group took part in a six-month series of workshops starting in April, first by video and then in person after the lockdown ended, where they learnt a variety of art techniques and styles from creating small books (zines) to 3D abstract sculpture and dioramas.

The fantastic results were then put on display in SPACE Ilford for a one-off exhibition on Wednesday 20 October, before being moved for display in the Redbridge Central Library.

**Saifur Valli, the Creative Project Facilitator at Space Ilford, said:** "The past year of the pandemic has been difficult for everyone, so it's been an amazing project and great to see all the participants enjoying the workshops and learning new skills. The participants have all grown individually, their dedication has been amazing."

**Indi, mother of One Place East participant Suraj, said:** "One Place East doesn't judge you and being around others with similar difficulties feels supportive. Everyone is friends in this safe and friendly environment.

"Suraj always had a passion for art from a very young age, but a trauma meant he could not finish his exams. The workshops allowed Suraj to once again be creative, helped him to calm his anxiety and gave him a real sense of achievement."

SPACE Ilford hosts art exhibits throughout the year and open **Wednesdays 11am – 5pm** and **Saturdays 11am – 4pm.**

### Keeping Redbridge Safe

Increase in face-to-face policing will see more police officers on your streets, an additional Enforcement Hub and a new

mobile CCTV vehicle.

#### **New Enforcement Hub**

Following a successful pilot of the York Road Enforcement Hub, a new Hub has been opened on Manford Way in Hainault.

The Hubs, which are staffed by police and council officers, give residents the opportunity to speak face to face with officers and highlight local issues. Our decision to install another Hub was made after the first Enforcement Hub on York Road led to a decrease in anti-social behaviour in the local area and received strong support from residents.

We hope to roll out further hubs in the new year, with Woodford being first on the list once we have consulted with local residents.

#### **Extra police officers**

More police officers will also soon be on patrol in Redbridge as part of a drive to engage more with residents on how to best tackle crime. The new team, which will be out on the beat in the first quarter of 2022, will be made up of 21 police constables, two sergeants and one inspector.


#### **New mobile CCTV van**

To support the new officers, we recently launched the 'Challenger' CCTV vehicle. Equipped with high definition cameras along its sides and on an elevated platform at the top, the vehicle can

Winter is a dangerous time for anyone who has to sleep rough. In Redbridge, the council works in partnership with local charities to tackle and prevent rough sleeping in the borough.

#### To stop people having to beg, alongside our partners we:

- provide people with emergency places to stay
- offer support with a wide range of health needs
- find people somewhere to live that's suitable for their longer-term needs
- help people move towards independence.

We understand that you might feel compelled to give money to someone begging on the street. However, many rough sleepers have complex issues around physical wellbeing, mental health and substance abuse.

By giving what you can spare directly to our partners, or volunteering, you can help people to make sustainable, life-changing steps that can end their rough sleeping for good.

## How we supported rough sleepers during the pandemic


Since March 2020 alongside our partners we have provided emergency accommodation for almost 400 rough sleepers, bringing everyone off the street at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Many rough sleepers were offered help and support for the first time, and are now moving on to sustainable, longer-term homes.

The services we can offer alongside our partners have been transformed for the future, with out of hospital care, extra support with drug and alcohol addiction and greater support for individuals without entitlement to state benefits.

The enhanced support includes 18 newly converted self-contained studio flats at the Ryedale scheme in Ilford, now being let on two-year leases to support local rough sleepers towards independence.

We are so pleased with what we have been able to achieve, but its the government rules on no recall to public finance for many that means we cannot house them permanently, which sadly leaves people in limbo.




### Project Malachi changing lives

Pop up hostel and workshop Project Malachi allows rough sleepers who are not entitled to state benefits to get the help and support they need.

Construction of the hostel was funded by Redbridge Council, who also made the land in Chadwick Road available to the Salvation Army while the regeneration of Ilford Town centre is ongoing.

Staffed by Salvation Army volunteers 24 hours a day, seven days a week, the project offers a broad range of support, from therapeutic support for mental health and substance misuse to assistance with securing work and training opportunities.






Help us improve safety standards in rented homes

The council are proposing to renew the Additional **Houses in Multiples Occupation (HMO) Licensing** Scheme. HMO's are shared homes that include flat and house shares, bedsits, and some buildings that are converted into flats.

The council wants to continue to improve HMO property conditions through licensing to make sure that they are safe, well managed

#### Redbridge awarded £100K funding for Minimum Energy **Efficiency Standards (MEES)**

The government launched a new campaign to help councils clamp down on bad landlords to improve the energy efficiency of rented accommodation.

Redbridge has been awarded £100,000 by the Department for Business Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS). The programme is designed to help councils engage or enforce against landlords with the worst performing properties.

New regulations introduced in April 2020 means privately rented homes must meet a minimum energy performance rating of EPC E, this makes it illegal to rent out properties below that unless landlords are exempt.

Poorly insulated properties impact private renters who struggle to keep homes warm and have higher energy bills.

The new rules are expected to ensure landlords improve energy efficiency with upgrades such as loft insulation, double glazing and cavity wall insulations. Landlords who fail their obligations may be fined of up to £5,000 per property and per breach.

# Hainault Forest's £7m restoration work under way


### Queen's Green Canopy to mark Platinum Jubilee

Everyone from individuals, community groups, schools and businesses are being encouraged to 'Plant a Tree for the Jubilee' up until March 2022, which is the official planting season.





### HIV and Tuberculosis (TB) could be on the rise

### Get tested

Rates of HIV and TB are at risk of rising in Redbridge, due to restricted access to health services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

HIV and the latent form of TB, which lives in the body but is not active, are both typically symptomless meaning they can be passed on easily.

If left undiagnosed, both can lead to serious health complications.

#### Who should get tested?

Everyone should get tested for HIV. However, some groups are disproportionally affected such as Black people of African descent.

TB can affect anyone. However, certain populations are at greater risk. They include newly arrived communities, people with reduced immunity and the BAME population.

People experiencing homelessness, drug or alcohol dependency, or with a prison history are also at greater risk.
