Children and young people are helping us to make Redbridge better for them.



They have told us what changes they want to see in the next couple of years.



We have planned those changes in six areas:

- 1. Safe and Secure
- 2. Being Healthy
- 3. Place
- 4. Co-operation and Leadership
- 5. Culture
- 6. Communication





1. Safe and Secure





We will make it safer to travel to school and make Redbridge a safer place to live.



We will know how well we are doing on Safe and Secure by testing pollution and road safety near schools and asking young people and women if they feel safer.





2. Healthy

We will get better at letting young people know how they can improve their physical and mental health.

We will make more places for young people in leisure centres. We will also support young people who look after people outside school.







We will know how well we are doing on Being Healthy by seeing if more children and young people are taking part in physical activities. We will ask if children and young people know how they can be supported with their needs outside school.





3. Place

We will help children and young people to be involved in making the environment better.

We will work with children and young people to make sure they feel welcome and safe in Redbridge.

We will make sure there are things for children and young people to do that don't cost too much.



We will know how well we are doing on Place by seeing if more children and young people get involved in work to improve the environment and projects to make Redbridge a better place to live.





4. Co-operation and Leadership



We will make sure that the people who make decisions about Redbridge include the views of children and young people.



We will know how well we are doing on Co-operation and Leadership by seeing how many people complete the Champions programme for this work.



5. Culture

We will aim to make sure that people in Redbridge stand up for children and young people and their rights.



We will know how well we are doing on Culture by carrying out a survey every year. We will also count how many people have had training on children's rights and autism.









6. Communication

We will help children and young people to find the information they need and tell them what they need to know in a way that's best for them.

We will share information about children's rights with children, young people and adults in different ways.



We will know how well we are doing on Communication by asking young people for their opinions and seeing how many children and young people help the Council in our work.



People doing this work meet every six weeks to talk about what they are doing.
