During my time here (since 2012) the green area adjacent to the path, managed by Epping forest was for a long time overgrown with brambles and thick vegetation, making it impassable so people at least since 2012 were diverting through the car park. The management of the adjacent area was altered due to complaints about rats and other vermin and Epping forest cut a large part of it back in 2018 and are now cutting this area twice a year with a tractor and brush cutter. But the area is still bounded by a ditch and a bund arrangement so is not particularly accessible as a walking route, and no route is maintained through the area.

There was an assumption by a lot of the residents that the whole area including the middle area of path was managed by Epping Forest.
