About Us

The Reach Out Centre of Excellence is part of Redbridge Council's award-winning Reach Out service. Founded in 2020, we provide support to survivors of domestic abuse in Redbridge (East London) and deliver training and consultancy to public and private sector organisations. Our services also include behaviour change programmes for perpetrators.

The service provides practical help and emotional support to victims/survivors, including children and young people who have been affected by domestic abuse. There is also help available for those who are worried about their behaviour and wish to address it.

We support all individuals aged 16 and over who are experiencing domestic abuse, regardless of gender or sexuality. We believe every survivor's story and recognise that each individual is an expert of their own experiences.

Safe & Together Model

The Safe and Together Model training is a cornerstone of our approach to improving outcomes for children and families impacted by domestic abuse.

This evidence-based framework emphasises a child-centred perspective, highlights the strengths and protective efforts of survivors, and focuses on the patterns of behaviour of those causing harm. By shifting the lens from victim-blaming to holding perpetrators to account, the training supports practitioners in delivering more effective, sustainable, and trauma-informed interventions.

We offer the opportunity for individuals or organisations to purchase places on this training. Participants will gain a deeper understanding of how to partner with survivors, keep children safe, and hold perpetrators accountable, all within their professional remit. The training is suitable for professionals across social care, health, education, policing, and the voluntary sector.

What's included in the training?

Built by experts using UK legislation, survivor insight, and frontline research, this animated, interactive module introduces key topics through engaging visuals and thought-provoking quizzes. Learners will explore:

- The different forms and definitions of abuse
- National trends and statistics
- Early warning signs and red flags
- Common myths and why people don't always speak out
- How to act safely and supportively when you suspect abuse

Open Up Perpetrator Programme

Reflecting on behaviours that may have negatively impacted others can be challenging. Confidential support is available for those seeking to make positive changes.

Open Up (previously named Spotlight) is a Respect-accredited programme for those who have been abusive and are committed to changing their behaviours. It provides a safe space where we will help people to develop respectful and non-abusive relationships.

Grounded in the belief that those who cause harm must take responsibility for their actions, the programme offers structured support to help participants understand the impact of their behaviour and develop healthier, non-abusive relationships. Open Up plays a vital role in breaking the cycle of abuse and promoting long-term safety for survivors and their families.

We welcome spot purchases for places on the programme, making it accessible to a wider range of services and individuals.

Open Up consists of 26 sessions, including one-to-one and group work.

Coercive Control: The Hidden Harm to Children and Young People

Children and young people living with coercive control often experience fear, confusion, and emotional distress, even when no physical violence is present. This training explores how patterns of manipulation, isolation, surveillance, and control within the home can deeply affect a child's development, relationships, and sense of identity.

Through real-life case examples, interactive discussion, and evidence-based frameworks, participants will gain a deeper understanding of:

- How coercive control manifests in family dynamics
- The psychological and developmental impact on children and young people
- The importance of multi-agency collaboration and trauma-informed practice
- How to identify signs and respond safely and supportively

This session is essential for professionals working with children, families, and survivors of domestic abuse.
